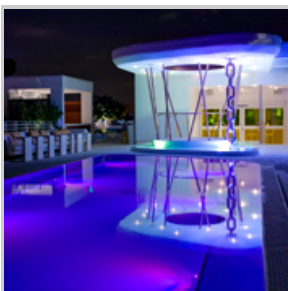

411: Holds up to 25 (cabana) or up to 275 (rooftop), Highbar, 1111 Collins Ave, 305-534-8455

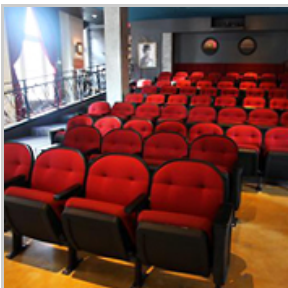


FOR THE WINE SNOBS IN ACCOUNTING

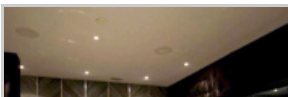


FOR A CINEMATIC BLOWOUT
